## SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All classes are open to all
- Entries should be received by the Flower Show Organiser by Friday 4<sup>th</sup> August 2017 to assist with the smooth running of this event.
- The committee have full power to accept or refuse an entry without stating the reason.
- Exhibits may be staged between 9.30 am and 10.30 am on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> August.
- All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor for not less than two months previous to the date of the show and must have been grown by him/her in gardens or allotments owned or rented by him/her (except in Floral Arrangement Classes).
- Exhibitors may stage only one entry in each class.
- Vases and all receptacles must be provided by the exhibitor.
- Class cards will be provided at the show. Exhibitors must place them face downwards in front of their exhibit.
- Exhibitors are requested to name their exhibits, if known, in the flower, fruit and vegetable sections.
- The judge's decision regarding the relative merits of exhibits shall be final.
- There is no prize money or entry fees for this show. Prize Cards will be awarded to all prize winning exhibits. Best Exhibits in each section will receive certificates.
- All exhibits must remain staged until 5pm. NO PRIOR REMOVAL WILL BE ALLOWED.
- All exhibits are accepted at the risk of the exhibitor, and the organisers shall not be liable for loss or damage or any other cause whatsoever.

## **FLOWER ARRANGEMENT SECTION**

Classes will have 30 inch (76cms) high, 24 inch (61cms) wide and 12 inch (30cm) deep niches for each entry. Exhibitors wishing to use drapes must provide their own support. The space allowed need not all be used up but must not be exceeded. An exhibit is plant material with or without accessories.

- "Tiny Gems" A miniature exhibit space allowed 10cms (4 ins) overall
- "Small is Beautiful" A petite exhibit space allowed 25cms (10 ins) overall
- "Look no flowers" An exhibit without flowers space allowed 61cms (24 ins)
- "Summer Spectacular" An exhibit, space allowed 61cms (24 ins)
- "Down the Garden Path" An exhibit using any plant material space allowed 61cms (24 ins)
- Novices only "My Favourite Arrangement" An exhibit using any plant material space allowed 61cms (24 ins)

## **CHILDRENS CLASSES**

All classes are open to children under 16 years of age only.

**Please state age of child at time of entering.**

Judges will take age into consideration while judging exhibits.

If there are enough entries classes will be divided into age groups.

- One Painting or Drawing
- One Decorated hard boiled egg or stone
- One Animal made from fruit and/or vegetables
- Four Decorated small cakes
- One miniature garden in a standard size seed tray

### **HEMECRAFT CLASSES**

- One Victoria sandwich
- Six pieces of Shortbread
- Six small Decorated cakes
- Six Cheese Straws
- One jar of Jam or Jelly

Cake covers will be supplied for all entries

### **HANDICRAFT CLASSES**

- One Painting or Drawing, any medium
- One Soft toy
- One Cushion
- One knitted item
- One Photograph
- Any other item of Handicraft not listed above
